

PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION/PUBLIC MANAGEMENT MAJOR

BACHELOR OF ARTS DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SCIENCES

OVERVIEW:

Public Administration is the management of the business of the citizens of a nation that is conducted by or receives major regulation from government. This major consists of a combination of courses in political science, business, and English which provide an academic background that is desirable for entry into public service careers in American national, state, or local government. It also is appropriate for students who plan to go on to graduate or professional schools and pursue post-baccalaureate degrees in public or business administration, political science, or law. A separate minor is not required for BA/Public Administration/Public Management majors.)

It is highly recommended, however, that all Public Administration/Public Management majors also take the six hours of United States history. Students interested in this major should contact the Public Administration/Public Management advisor in the Department of Social Sciences for information and advice. Planning your program requires attention to detail because most required courses are offered only once per year.

Elective Courses – 9 hours

Public Administration majors are required to take 6 hours of **Political Science elective courses** and 3 hours of **Business Administration elective courses**. Foreign Language Option – 12 hours

Public Administration majors are required to complete 12 hours of foreign language courses **OR** Financial Analysis Option (see below).

Financial Analysis Option – 12 hours
