Job Description: Assistant Professor of Counselor Education, 9-month, visiting professor position available August 2021. This position would also include acting as Practicum and Internship Coordinator for the Counselor Education program, with management of the data system for students and sites. Primary teaching responsibilities include face-to-face, hybrid, and online graduate courses in research, assessment, play therapy, internship and related counseling areas. Supervision of clinical field experiences and research leading to publications and presentations at academic conferences is expected. The faculty workload consists of the teaching equivalent of nine graduate credit hours per semester. Additional duties include academic advising, research and scholarship, university service, collaboration, accreditation related activities, promotion of the program and the university, and other duties as assigned by the department chair.

Qualifications: Henderson State University is an Equal Opportunity/Affirmative Action Employer with a significant commitment to the achievement of excellence and diversity among its faculty, staff, and students. In pursuit of this commitment, candidates for both positions will possess an earned doctorate in Counselor Education and Supervision (ABD considered) from a CACREP accredited institution. Candidates should have experience in teaching courses in research, assessment, play therapy, clinical mental health counseling or school counseling at the university level; scholarly achievement in teaching, research and service; and activity in appropriate professional societies. Strong interpersonal skills, online education experience, excellent organizational and communication skills are expected.

Preferred Qualifications: Preferred candidates will hold a specialization in school counseling or eligibility for relevant licensure as Registered Play Therapist-Supervisor.
