Job Description: Educational Leadership faculty member, nine-month position beginning August 2022. The successful applicant will teach synchronous online courses offered as part of nationally recognized programs in educational leadership. The teaching load will include graduate courses in research methods, public school finance, facilities management, or other educational leadership topics related to the NELP standards. Additional duties include, but are not limited to, academic advising, research, university service, collaboration, scholarship, and other duties as assigned by the department chair.

Qualifications: Henderson State University is an Equal Opportunity/Affirmative Action Employer with a significant commitment to the achievement of excellence and diversity among its faculty, staff, and students. In pursuit of this commitment, candidates will possess a doctoral degree (ABD or strong academic credentials considered) in Educational Administration or related field from a regionally accredited institution. A demonstrated record of public school administrative experience at the building and district levels is expected. Applicants should demonstrate a comprehensive understanding of national leadership standards, educational research methods, Arkansas public school finance, facilities management, educational law, and the specific role and duties of an educational leader. The ideal candidate will have higher education online teaching experience and experience in guiding student research. Strong interpersonal skills, excellent organizational and communication skills, and a commitment to the use of technology and online instruction using synchronous technologies is expected. The ability to plan and deliver effective online instruction and work effectively as an advisor is required.

Salary: Commensurate with qualifications and experience.
