Job Description: Nine-month, non-tenure track mathematics instructor position. The teaching load will typically be 15 hours each semester with the possibility of summer employment. Courses taught would include general education mathematics and statistics courses, as well as entry-level mathematics courses for P - 8 education majors. Expectations of the position include demonstrated interest in increasing competence through professional development opportunities. Strong teaching performance generally assures yearly contract renewal.
