Job Description: Special Education Instructor or Assistant Professor (tenure track), Department of Advanced Instructional Studies, 9-month position beginning July 2019. The position includes teaching and/or co-teaching undergraduate and graduate courses in special education, supervision of program candidates in practicum courses, and academic advising. Involvement in student recruitment, university service, collaboration, and scholarship is expected.

Qualifications: Henderson State University is an Equal Opportunity/Affirmative Action Employer with a significant commitment to the achievement of excellence and diversity among its faculty, staff, and students. In pursuit of this commitment, candidates will possess a master's degree including at least 18 graduate hours in Special Education, Behavioral Science or closely related field from a regionally accredited institution with the expectation to complete a related doctoral degree within a given time frame. An earned doctorate or ABD status is required for the tenure-track assistant professor rank. The candidate must possess (or be eligible for) a teaching license in special education and have at least four years of classroom teaching experience in elementary and secondary special education settings. Experience as an Educational Examiner is desirable. Strong interpersonal, organizational and communication skills are expected along with a commitment to the use of technology and online instruction. The ability to plan and deliver effective instruction to adult learners, pursue scholarly activities, engage in service, and work effectively as an advisor is anticipated.

Salary: Commensurate with qualifications and experience.
